

### **Teams Day**

The 49th Annual Team's Day will be held this Friday 21, September, 2018 at Coronation Park, The Channon.



Team's Day is an opportunity for surrounding schools to join the students from The Channon to collaboratively participate in friendly games of Soccer, T-Ball and Danish Rounders. The K/1/2 students play Danish Rounders which involves the students hitting a ball from a tee and running between diamond bases. Students in year 3/4/5/6 choose to play T-Ball or Soccer in small teams. Both games focus on skill, coordination and team work. We will have 9 schools in attendance comprising over 300 students.

This is a major fundraiser for The Channon P&C. We encourage all families to help out in some way, whether working at the canteen or donating baked goods or fresh produce. Money raised will go back into supporting the students including the purchase of new and engaging books for the library, subsidised excursions in the future and to further enhance the school vegetable garden that will link in with our school canteen program.

### **Public Speaking Presentations**


